### Dear Families

We have had a great first week and as you can see, we have so many exciting events happening this term.

We had a great Science Week with the children sharing their experiments in some fantastic assemblies yesterday. This replaced our certificate assemblies.

We have lots of year groups going out on trips to all sorts of exciting places. We know the challenges of paying for trips and will always keep them under £15 per child. 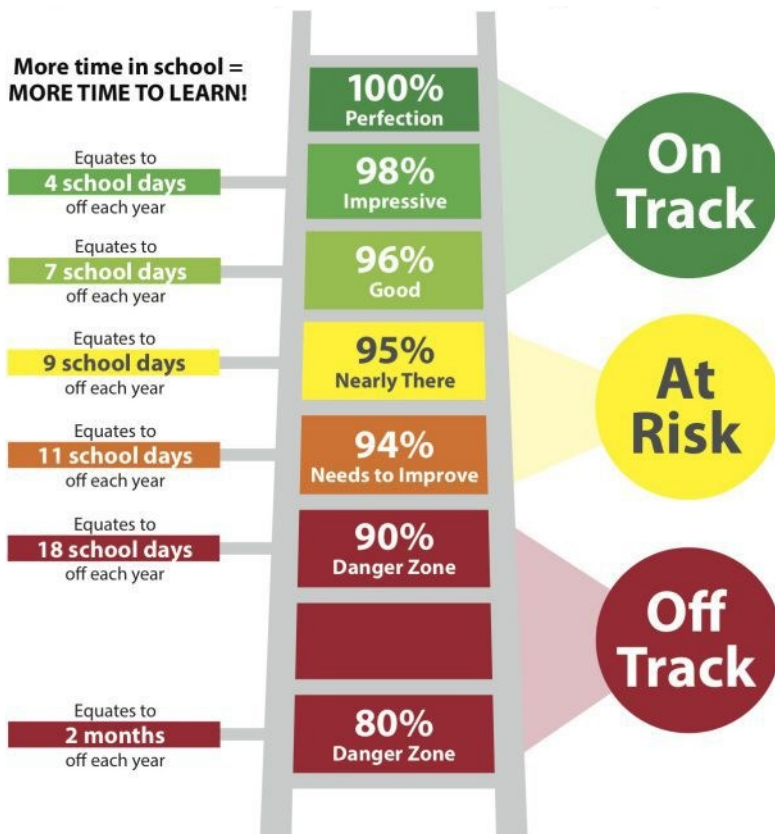

## Our Belmore Motivators - to celebrate and encourage children to do the right thing:

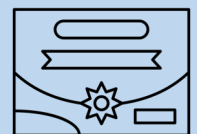
Specific praise when someone does the right thing



Dojo Points—This is an online platform where each child has a mini monster which earns points when they follow the school values and rules. There's a prize for all the children who earn over 120 Dojo points over a half term. In September, parents will be able to log on and see how many points their child has.
