We have started a new phonics scheme at Belmore called Little Wandle which enables children to learn their sounds much faster and introduces books in a way which not only helps them learn to read but also understand what they are reading. We have started the lessons this week and reading books and logins to the online books will follow shortly depending on your child's year group. In years 3-6 we also have a new reading curriculum. Children will be studying a class book in their reading lessons as well as the teacher just reading a book every day purely for enjoyment—see below what each year group is reading.
