We have had a busy getting back into the swing of learning. We have started a new phonics scheme at Belmore called Little Wandle which enables children to learn their sounds much faster and introduces books in a way which not only helps them learn to read but also understand what they are reading. We have started the lessons this week and reading books and logins to the online books will follow shortly depending on your child's year group.
